in their University —

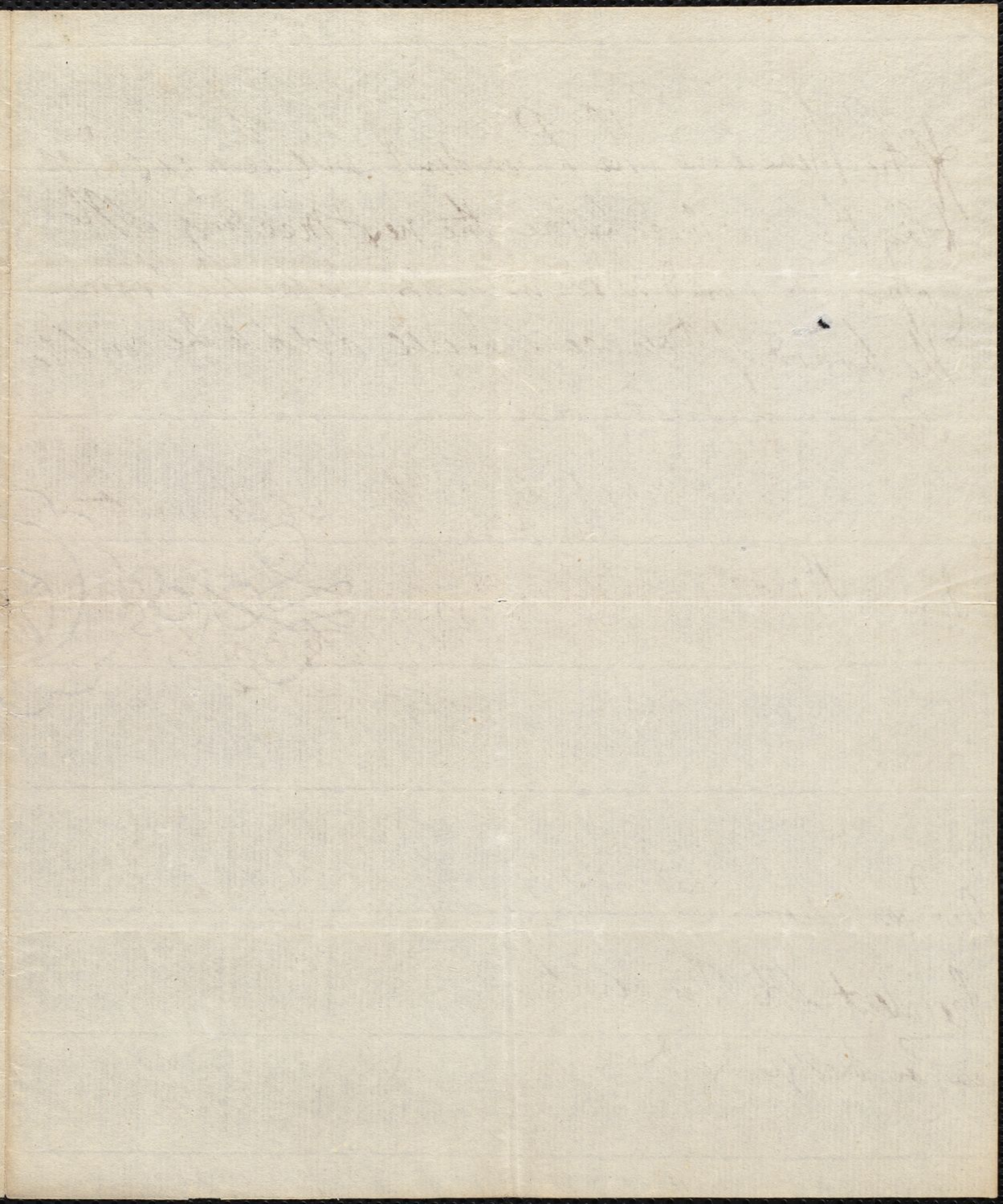
