IN REPLY TO A LETTER FROM THE SECRETARY OF THE INTERIOR

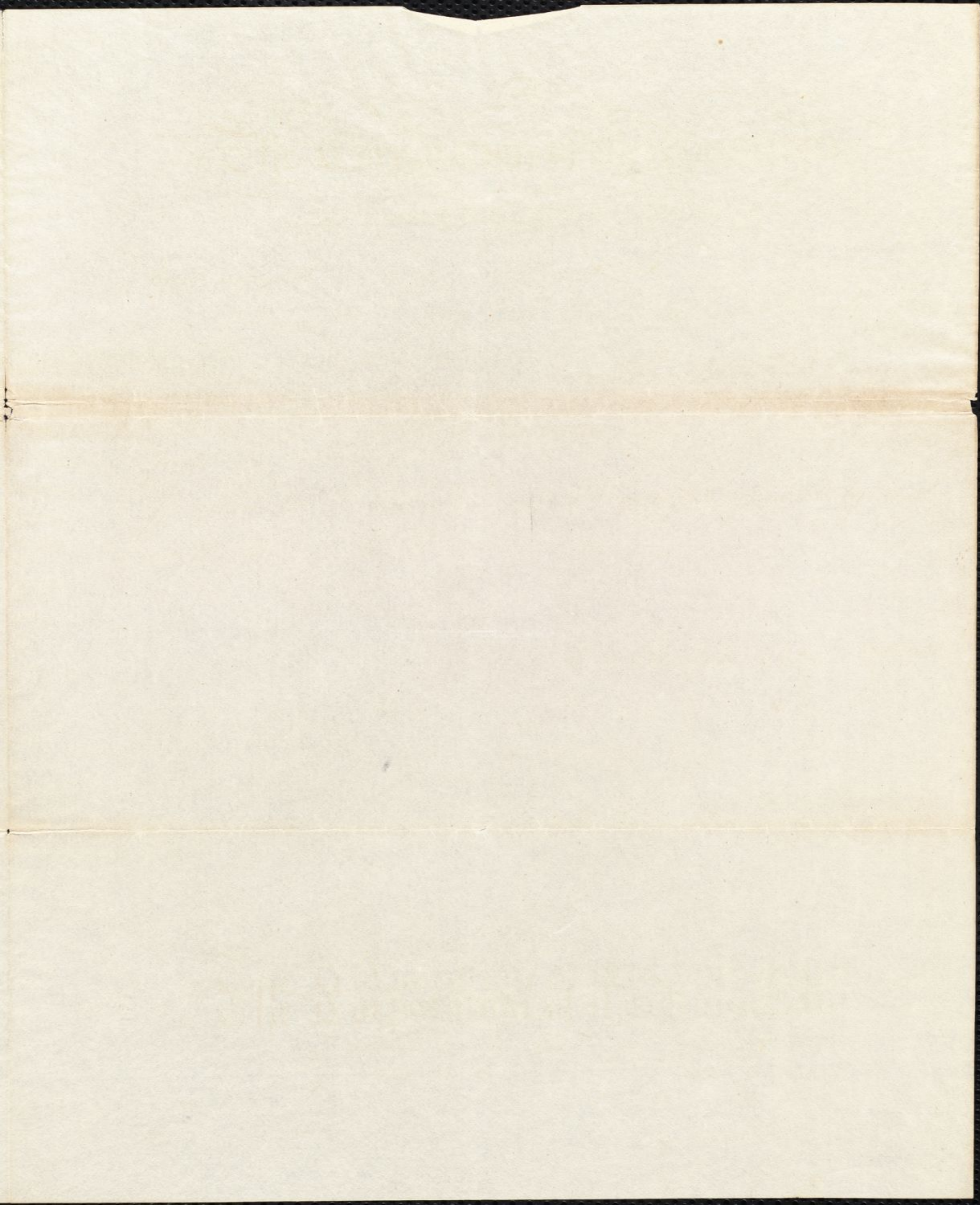
Dear Sir: I have the honor to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 10th inst. in relation to the proposed extension of the public lands in the State of California.

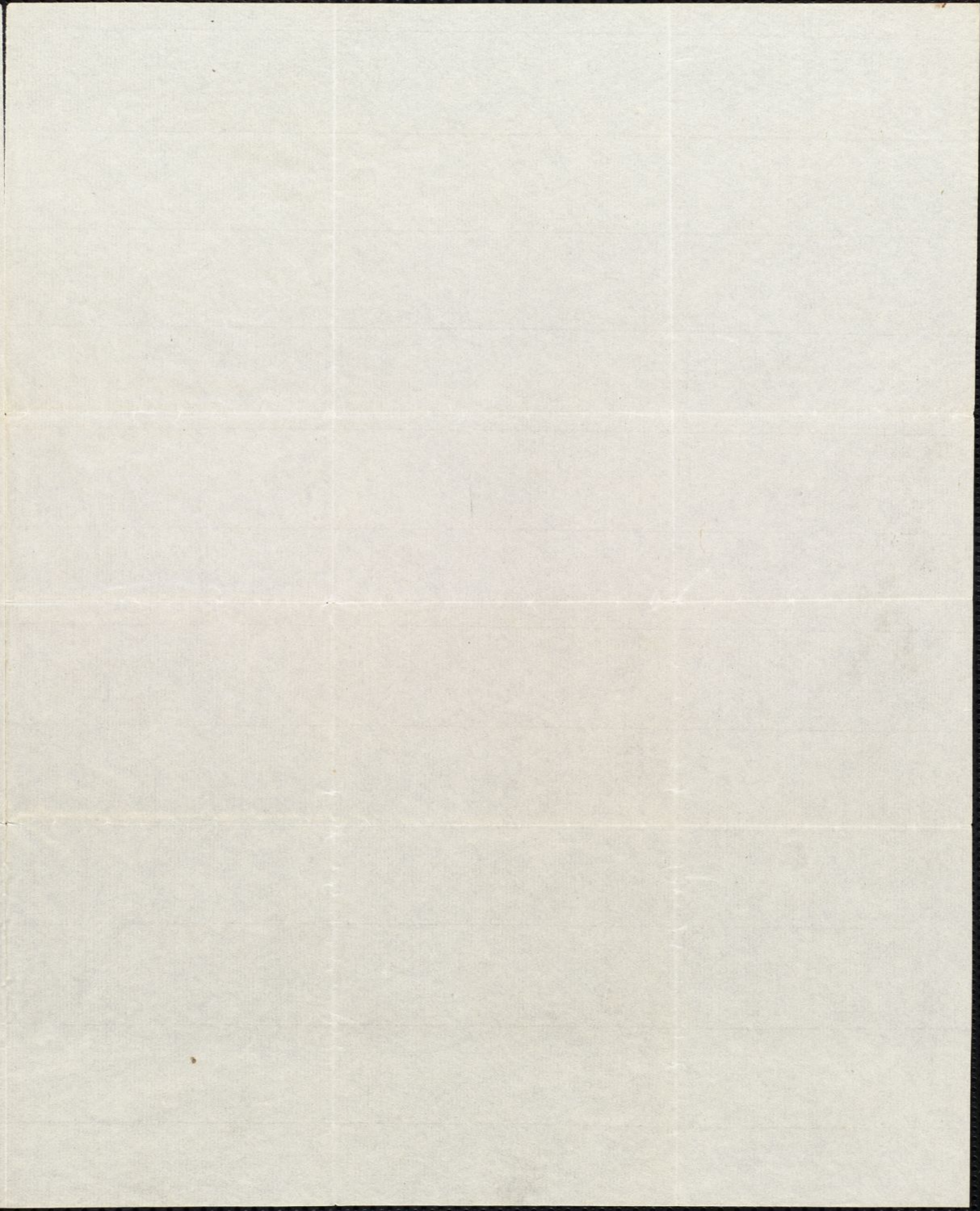
