

At a meeting of the Corporation of Harvard College in Boston Oct 6. 1810

The petition of Professor Waterhouse that he may be admitted to the same privileges in the Almshouse in Boston, granted to the other Professors; and thereupon Voted, that the Corporation do not think it expedient to act upon the said application, until Dr Waterhouse shall signify to the Corporation, his agreement to conform to the permission of the Corporation and officers relating to the extension of the medical establishment to Boston.
