Dear Sir

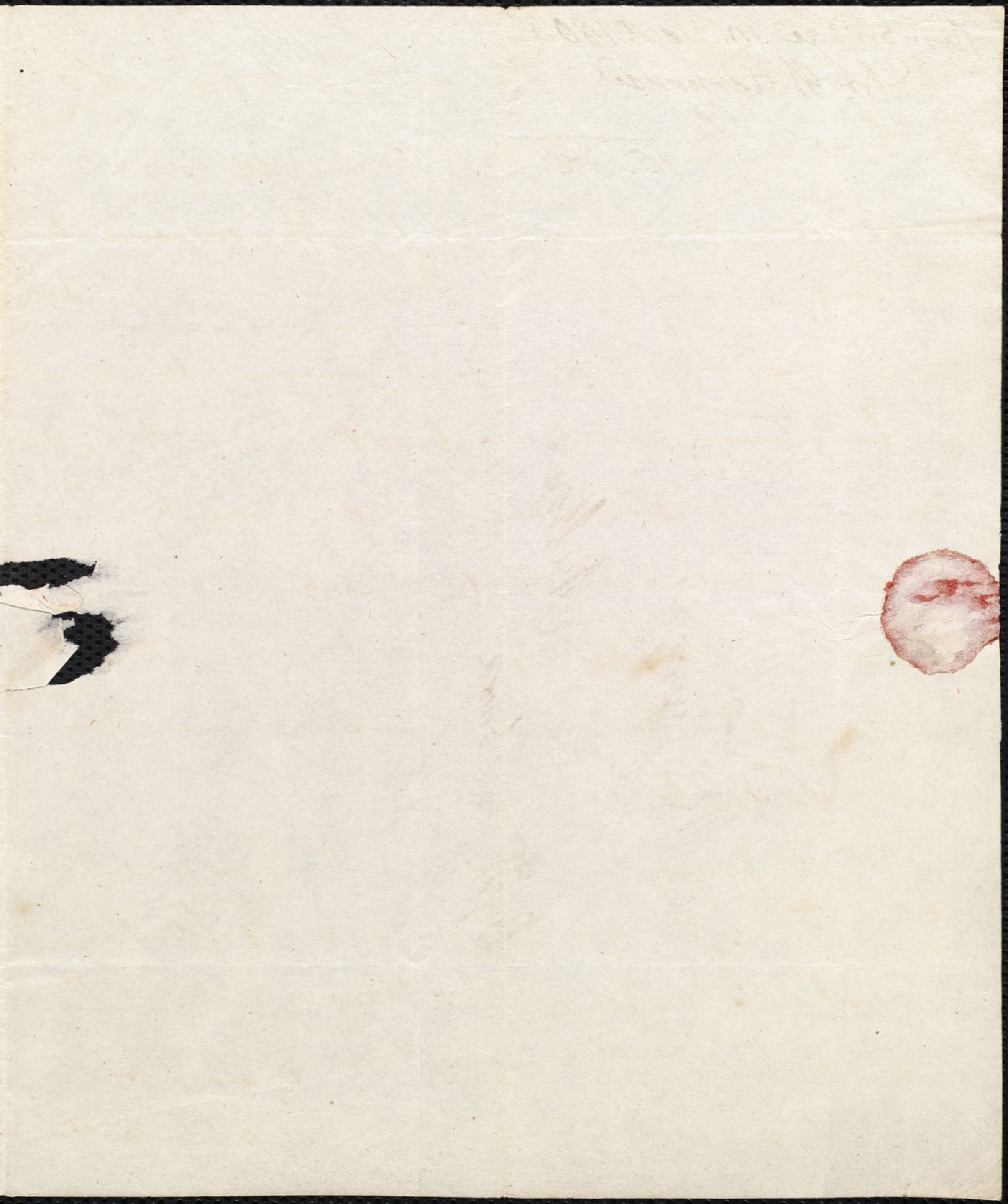
I send by the hands of D. Holebrook
