GOOD EVENING. MY NAME IS WILMA BULKIN SIEGEL AND I SERVE AS THE CHAIR OF THE MORANI AWARDS COMMITTEE FOR THE FOUNDATION FOR THE HISTORY OF WOMEN IN MEDICINE.

THE ALMA DEA MORANI, M.D. RENAISSANCE WOMAN AWARD WAS ESTABLISHED 5 YEARS AGO TO RECOGNIZE AN OUTSTANDING WOMAN PHYSICIAN OR SCIENTIST IN NORTH AMERICA WHO HAS DEMONSTRATED EXCELLENCE IN HER CHOSEN FIELD OF MEDICINE AND WHO HAS CONTINUED TO HAVE A THIRST FOR KNOWLEDGE AND SERVICE BEYOND HER PRACTICE OF MEDICINE OR HER SCIENTIFIC ENDEAVORS.

EACH YEAR THE AWARDS COMMITTEE IS PRESENTED WITH MANY CANDIDATES, ALL OF WHOM HAVE DEMONSTRATED OUTSTANDING LEADERSHIP IN MEDICINE AND WHO HAVE EXCELLED BEYOND THEIR CHOSEN FIELD. WE STRUGGLE EACH YEAR TO CHOOSE THE MOST DESERVING CANDIDATE. OUR MODEL REMAINS ALMA DEA MORANI, M.D. , WOMAN'S MEDICAL COLLEGE CLASS OF 1931.

DR. MORANI WAS THE FIRST WOMAN TO BE ACCEPTED INTO THE SOCIETY FOR PLASTIC SURGEONS. SHE WAS A WORLD TRAVELER, A MENTOR FOR YOUNG WOMEN IN MEDICINE, AN ARTIST, AND A COLLECTOR.

SHE BELIEVED THAT ART PLAYED AN IMPORTANT ROLE IN MEDICINE. SHE ESTABLISHED, WITH HER OWN FUNDS, AN ART GALLERY AT THE MEDICAL SCHOOL WHERE SHE INTRODUCED THE STUDY OF ART INTO THE CURRICULUM AND SPONSORED ART EXHIBITIONS FOR PHYSICIANS.

ALMA DEA MORANI SET THE STANDARD FOR THE RENAISSANCE WOMAN. I AM PLEASED TO INTRODUCE SHIRLEY BONNEM, VICE-CHAIR FOR THE AWARDS COMMITTEE, TO INTRODUCE THIS YEAR'S AWARDEE.
