The Foundation for the History of Women in Medicine

Established in 1998, the Foundation for the History of Women in Medicine was founded with the belief that knowing the historical past is a powerful force in shaping the future. Though relatively young, the Foundation for the History of Women in Medicine has accomplished the following: established the Alma Dea Morani Award recognizing nationally the leadership of outstanding women in medicine; created a research fellowship through The College of Physicians of Philadelphia; and provided a grant to initiate the digitization project to the Archives and Special Collections on Women in Medicine at the Drexel University College of Medicine. Affiliations currently exist with The College of Physicians of Philadelphia and the Association of American Medical Colleges.

The Oral History Project:

A tribute to Eight Renaissance Women (2000 – 2007)

The Oral History Project will highlight the first eight (8) recipients of the Foundation's Renaissance Award. The Foundation for the History of Women in Medicine presents the Alma Dea Morani, MD Renaissance Woman Award annually in honor of an outstanding woman physician or scientist in North America who has furthered the practice and understanding of medicine in our lifetime and made significant contributions outside of medicine, for example, in the humanities, arts or social sciences; whose determination and spirit have carried her beyond traditional pathways in medicine and science; and who challenges the status quo with a passion for learning.

The Oral History Project will allow for the oral histories to be completed for six of the eight living award recipients including, in some cases, videotaped presentations. A portrait of each recipient may be included as part of this comprehensive project. The Oral History Project will be coordinated by the Foundation's Oral History Committee and will commence in the fall of 2007 and be completed by December 2010.

The Randforce Associates, LLC

Randforce is helping a broad range of oral history and qualitative analysis clients, like the Foundation, to digitize and index audio-video documentation. The Randforce approach uses a unique database environment that can organize and access the audio-video content itself, not transcript or text reductions. Utilizing and refining new digital technologies including the InterClipper® software initially developed for the market research field by **InterClipper, INC.** Randforce helps clients work with any audio-video documentation, including oral history and other interviews, fieldwork, focus groups, meeting minutes, performance, and home video. Applications range from oral history collection management and access, to indexing tools for qualitative research, pedagogic resources, museum, library, community, and family projects.

Maria Cerny Brabb, MD Scholarship

Maria Cerny Brabb, MD, WMC 1958 made an endowment gift in 1999 to establish scholarship support for female students at Drexel University College of Medicine and to support the operating budget of the Foundation for the History of Women in Medicine annually. The Fund has provided scholarships annually and leadership financial support for the Foundation. Dr. Brabb made the gift in memory of her mother; the gift will live in perpetuity helping hundreds of young women who wish to study medicine, thereby continuing to write the history of women in medicine.
