***Mary Guinan, M.D., Ph.D.
2006 Alma Dea Morani Award Recipient***

Dr. Mary Guinan has championed disease control and prevention for three decades. She is currently on the board of directors of the Nevada Public Health Foundation and she has served as Nevada's state health officer where she worked to fluoridate Nevada's water supply and to address the state's large smoking problem.

Dr. Guinan worked for the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, where she examined disease from a population perspective rather than the individual perspective. At the CDC, she was involved with their original AIDS Task Force, investigating the first cases of AIDS for the CDC. She is often credited with being the first to identify AIDS as an epidemic.

Dr. Guinan began working at the CDC in 1974, when she took part in the historic effort to eliminate smallpox in Uttar Pradesh, India. She continued there for 22 years as a physician, scientist and administrator. Dr. Guinan holds a Ph.D. from the University of Texas and an M.D. from Johns Hopkins University.
