small doses. — with Dovers Powders. A bad case of
chronic dysen^a by gentle purging with oil and
followed by this mixture Magnes: alba ℥ij. Gum
Arab: ℥ij Sach: alb: ℥ij: Kino ℥j. Laud^m gr^{ss} c.
Aqua. ℥viij. It was Dysentery siglosa. This removed
the stools natural, with a bleeding & sudorifics. Since
that cured by solid food & flax seed tea, with two
injections of Speac. Zps Laud^m gr^{ss} x. each —
one tertian intermittent or perhaps double tertian —
one intermittent headache, which did not yield to
Fowler's mineral solution but to a combination
I never before heard of — Pulvigo Ferri gr^{ss} x Pulv.
Rhei. gr^{ss} xv. — one case of obstinate ophthalmia —
many Absteric^{cases} and at least ten expectations — No
bad ones as yet. Only one dead child. Broken ribs
but no broken limbs nor dislocated. Have lost
only two this winter — one a child almost dead
with consumption. The other a child with con-
vulsions, no typhus. Many of Pneumonia which
without exception I bleed and no typhus appeared.
Some cases have occurred, distroying in a few
hours to no alarm remains in the city,
